Professor of History**

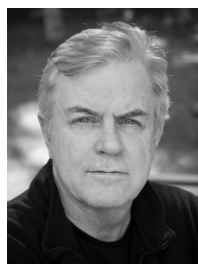
PhD in History and Middle Eastern Studies, Harvard University, USA

Nadia El Cheikh comes to NYUAD from the American University of Beirut in Lebanon, where she was the dean of the Faculty of Arts and Sciences and a professor of history, leading a division of 3,700 students, 400 faculty, and 100 staff. She is a highly accomplished scholar of the Abbasid Caliphate and Byzantium, with a focus on women, gender, and Islam.

El Cheikh has published two monographs: *Women, Islam and Abbasid Identity* and *Byzantium Viewed by the Arabs*; and co-authored *Crisis and Continuity at the Abbasid Court: Formal and Informal Politics in the Caliphate of al-Muqtadir*. In 2019, she received a \$1 million Andrew W. Mellon Foundation grant for an oral history project, *The Arab Oral History Archive: Gender, Alternative Histories, and the Production of Knowledge*.

El Cheikh has been visiting professor and scholar at Harvard, Columbia, University of California Los Angeles, Amherst College, and New York University. She also served as a member of the International Advisory Board of the NYU Press and NYU Abu Dhabi's Library of Arabic Literature, which she has championed from its inception.

Mark Jenkinson has been a working professional photographer for the last 40 years. He has photographed hundreds of feature stories on a vast array of subjects including fashion, celebrity portraiture, sports, business, travel, architecture and automobiles. Publications include *Vogue*, *Vanity Fair*, *Fortune*, *GQ*, *Town and Country*, *Men's Journal*, and *The New York Times*. He has also published three text books on photography techniques and practices: *Photography Essentials*, *The Portrait Photography Course*, and *Careers in Photography: Finding your True Path*.

His personal photography projects include a 30-year documentation on the evolution of Las Vegas as an urban phenomenon, a 15-year project examining capital punishment in the United States as well as other smaller projects on color interaction. He has a lifelong interest in theoretical physics and is currently researching how evolving theories in the history of science have influenced the history of art. In addition to his professional career, Jenkinson has been teaching at NYU for over 35 years.

KONSTANTINOS KYRIAKOPOULOS

Professor of Electrical and Computer Engineering

PhD in Computer and Systems Engineering, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, USA

Konstantinos (Kostas) Kyriakopoulos is professor of electrical engineering. Kostas works on real time embedded control systems and robotics with emphasis on multi-agent autonomous systems (ground, marine, aerial). His current interest is in decentralized interaction control of hybrid autonomous systems.

He was awarded the G.Samaras award of academic excellence (NTUA), the Bodosakis Foundation Fellowship, the Alexander Onassis Foundation Fellowship and the Alexander Von Humboldt Fellowship. He has published around 330 papers to journals and fully refereed international conferences. He is the specialty chief editor for Frontiers in Robotics and AI, senior editor of IEEE/ASME Transactions on Mechatronics and he serves in the editorial committees of a number of publications, in addition to serving as an administrative member of a number of international conferences. He has directed 40 research projects funded by the EC and Greek Sources. He is an IEEE Fellow.

Prior to joining NYU, Kyriakopoulos served as faculty at the Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and the National Technical University of Athens.

Jeff Manza is Professor of Sociology and the former chair of the Department of Sociology at New York University. Prior to joining NYU in 2006, he taught at Penn State (1996-98) and Northwestern (1998-2006).

His teaching and research interests lay at the intersection of inequality, political sociology, and public policy. His research examines how different types of social identities and inequalities influence political processes such as voting, partisanship, and public opinion (at both the macro and micro level).

Barbara Scheck is the professor for entrepreneurship at Munich Business School and co-founder of the European Center for Social Finance. Her research focuses on the financing of social enterprises, impact and mission-related investing, and impact assessment. Prior to joining MBS, Barbara was an assistant professor for social investment at Hamburg University.

During her PhD she developed the Social Reporting Standard, guidelines for impact-oriented reporting. Other significant experiences include consulting for a social venture capital fund and projects for development cooperation agencies on social entrepreneurship. She was a visiting fellow at the Asia Centre for Social Entrepreneurship & Philanthropy at NUS National University of Singapore and is a co-founder of the digital mentoring platform Volunteer Vision. Scheck was a member of the EU's GECES subgroup on impact measurement in social enterprise and the Impact Measurement Working Group of the Social Impact Investment Task Force established by the G8. She is a member of the investment committee at GLS Treuhand.

Lucia Gemma Delogu is currently leading the ImmuneNano-lab at the University of Padua, Italy. She has a scientific background related to nanotechnology, immunology and applied biochemistry. In 2011, she was selected as one of the "200 Best Young Talents of Italy" from the Italian Ministry of Youth and since has received several awards.

She served the European Commission as an invited expert for different review panels of FP7 and Horizon 2020. She has been granted by the University of Padua for "STARS", a highly competitive call, with a project on MXenes material biomedical applications. She has been the scientific coordinator of two interdisciplinary European Projects (G-IMMUNOMICS and CARBO-IMMAP) on nanomedicine and nanosafety involving ten leading Institutions in EU and extra EU Countries including China, USA and Qatar. She is head of the biology section for the project funded by the European Space Agency, Whiskies, on wound healing, nanomaterials, and immune cell interaction for applications on the hearth and in Space.

ÖMER F. ÖRSÜN

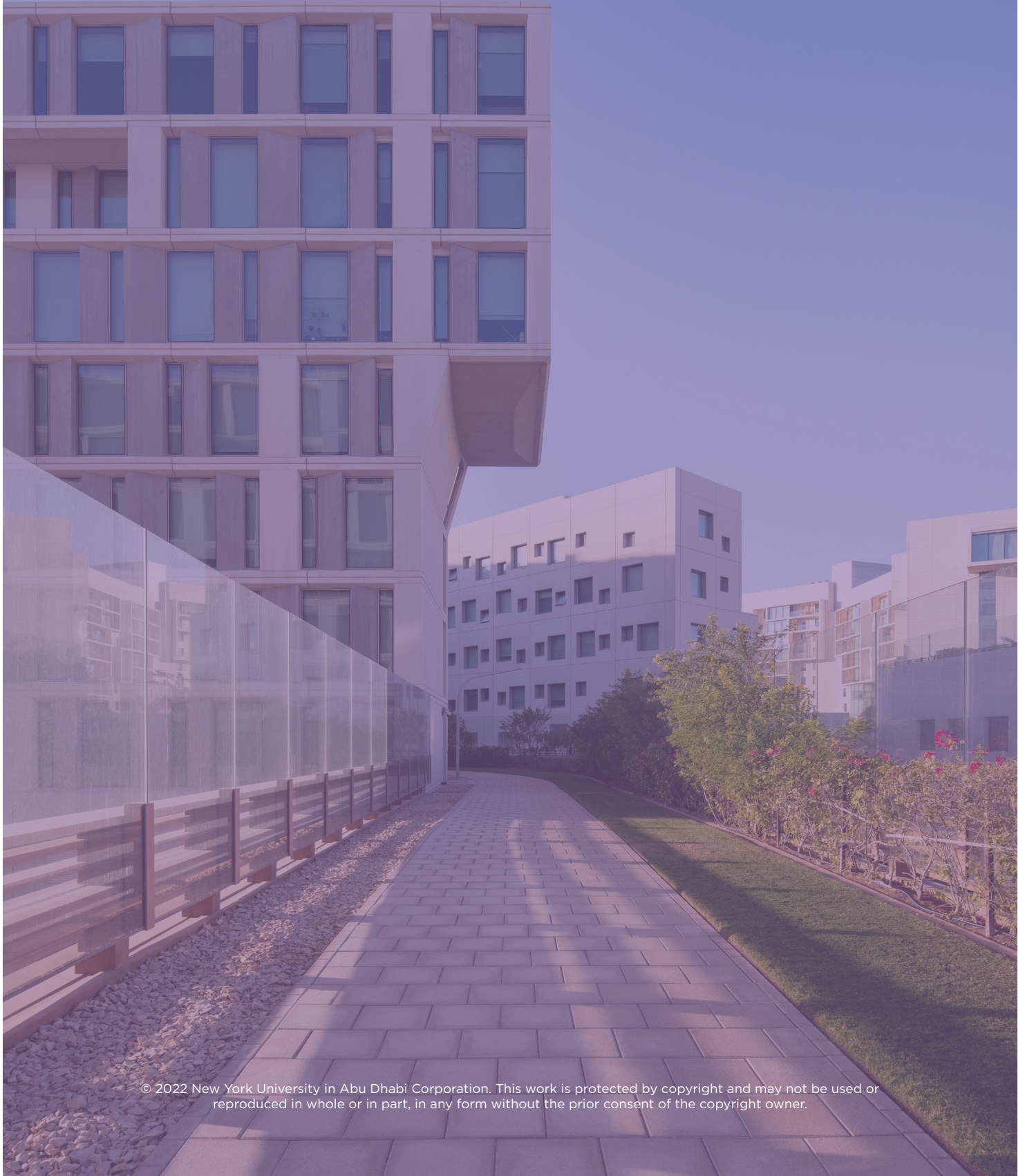
Visiting Lecturer of Political Science
